The Black Church Stands with the Citizens of Norway

Washington DC – The National Black Church Initiative (NBCI), a faith-based coalition of 34,000 churches comprised of 15 denominations and 15.7 million African Americans, relays its deepest support to the people of Norway whose citizens were brutally attacked in Anders Breivik’s killing spree that took place July 28, 2011 on the island of Utoya.

As a national African American organization dedicated to eradicating violence worldwide, NBCI offers its thoughts and prayers to the families and individuals whose lives have been forever changed by the horrific loss of life.

Rev. Anthony Evans, President of NBCI says, “The senseless murder of so many of innocent Norwegian citizens is both a heartbreaking and inexplicable tragedy.
