THE NATIONAL BLACK CHURCH PRESIDENT REV. ANTHONY EVANS HOSTS BLACK FAMILY REVIVAL

PRESS CONFERENCE WILL OUTLINE 10- YEAR STRATEGY TO STRENGTHEN BLACK FAMILY

Washington D.C. – Rev. Anthony Evans, President of the National Black Church Initiative (NBCI), a coalition of 34,000 churches, will travel to Elizabethtown, North Carolina to unveil NBCI's National African American Family Circle Initiative.

There will be a news conference at 11 a.m. on September 22 at Mt. Zion African Episcopal Methodist Zion Church. At this morning news conference Rev. Evans and Rev. Sewell will outline a 10-year plan to heal the black family through the establishment of black family circles all across the country.

NBCI is committed to strengthening the African American family by repairing the damage created by un-married parents, weak moral standards, and years of neglecting to address this truly pressing societal issue. The family unit is an essential component in the fabric of American life and the success of the Black community depends on the Church's vigorous defense of the traditional family. Studies have shown that children thrive on the love and support of two parents – it is this basic fact that propels NBCI to take action to protect the family by safeguarding and promoting marriage between a man and a woman, educating African Americans on the importance of health and financial responsibility, involving therapy to repair at-risk relationships, preventing violence, and creating new standards for families nationwide. It is time to stand up for the family and create a better future for our children.
