NBCI President, Rev. Anthony Evans, Demands President Obama to Order Attorney General Holder to File Civil Rights Charges Against George Zimmerman, the Time for Talking is Over

Please Mr. President Do Something for Black People for the First Time

Washington DC – The National Black Church Initiative (NBCI) is a faith-based coalition of 34,000 churches comprised of 15 denominations and 15.7 million African Americans churchgoers. We love President Obama and his family. This is why we have given him over 96% of our votes in 2008 and in 2012. Sadly to this date, however, he and his administration have done little to nothing for the black community in a variety of areas. The President's address to the nation yesterday was heartfelt, honest and forthright concerning the Trayvon Martin murder case. The President has been forced to address this issue because he was afraid that his inactions will lead to a nation at risk. We will take the President at his word but in the black community his words have been empty and void of any action or caring for black people.

We are tired of President Obama ignoring our concerns.

The President's lack of action for his own community throughout his time in office has been disrespectful and disappointing. His office has been so consumed about what white people think to the point of systematically creating structure that ignores, deflects and bamboozles any legitimate request on policies or programs coming from the black community. Even the President had to admit that we are not living in a post racial society and that racism is as common as baseball and apple pie. Since his 2008 campaign created this false notion of a post racial society because of his historic election.

The Rev. Anthony Evans, President of the National Black Church Initiative states emphatically that “We respect the jury system and its verdict, but whole-heartedly disagree with its philosophical legal rationale of acquitting George Zimmerman, a wannabe cop, of killing an unarmed child. The Black Church is tired of the inaction of this President and his empty rhetoric. We demand that he use the power that is given to him by the American people as the chief law enforcement official of this country. This is both morally shameful and reprehensible. The Black Church will not let this President off the hook and we will also not allow Rev. Al Sharpton and the gang to tell us that he cannot do anything for black people. We do not want to hear that crap this time. By the way Mr. President, black people are Americans too if you forgot and you are charged under our constitution to serve black and white – not just white people.”

Now that the White House can no longer control the legitimate moral sentiments of the black community it is lost on how to adequately respond to this black power movement that has been created by the evil process and verdict of the Trayvon Martin case. Trayvon Martin’s life and death may turn out to be a defining moment, not only in our nation’s history, but for black reawakening political power and influence. NBCI hopes to utilize our involvement in this struggle for dignity as a catalyst to create an environment where we begin to announce permanent and sensible solutions in the area of education, housing, healthcare, economics and a new political black structure.”
